ROARING RECIPE: TRIFLE

Ingredients:

- One vanilla cake (any recipe works, even boxed is fine)
- 1 ¼ cups of mixed berries (frozen berries work very good)
- 1 tsp lemon juice
- 1 tbsp cornstarch
- ¼ cup of water
- ⅓ cup of sugar + more if needed
- 1 cup heavy whipping cream
- ¼ cup of pudding (optional)



Directions:

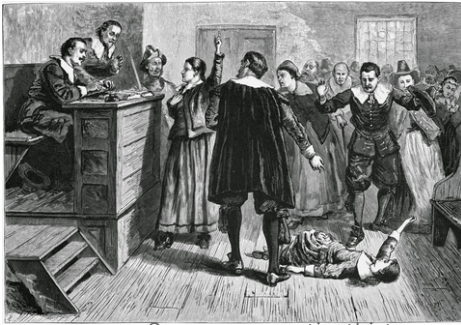
1. Bake your cake and cool it completely.
2. Put your berries in a saucepan and add the water, lemon juice, and sugar. Bring it to a boil until the berries start bursting. Then simmer on low flame and use a potato masher or a fork to create a sauce. Make sure to keep tasting and adding sugar if you need to. Then add the cornstarch and mix until it is all incorporated. Let it cool completely.
3. Make the cream mixture by whipping your cream almost all the way and setting it aside. Then make your pudding and make sure it is fully cooled before adding it to your cream, and finish whipping your cream with the pudding inside. (Be sure to taste to see if you still need to add sugar, or if the pudding added enough sweetness). If you are not using pudding, just add powdered sugar (as per your taste)
4. After all three components are cooled fully, it is time to put it all together. Cut the cake into 1 ½ inch strips and lay them in your serving dish. Then spoon on the berry sauce, and then spread on the cream mixture. Keep repeating until you run out of cake and finish with cream on top.

Tips:

- Cool all the way. Leave it in the fridge overnight. Make it so cold that touching it is painful. (Do not turn it into ice!)
- Keep tasting to see how much sugar you need. Especially the berry sauce, because the sweetness of them varies. Also, everyone likes a different level of sweetness so make sure you adjust.

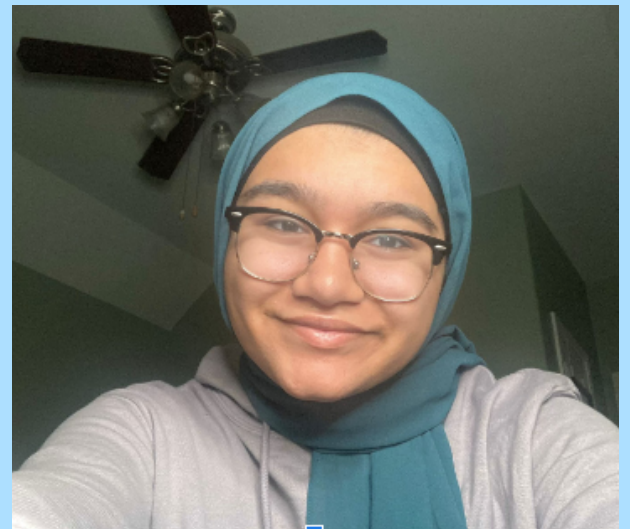

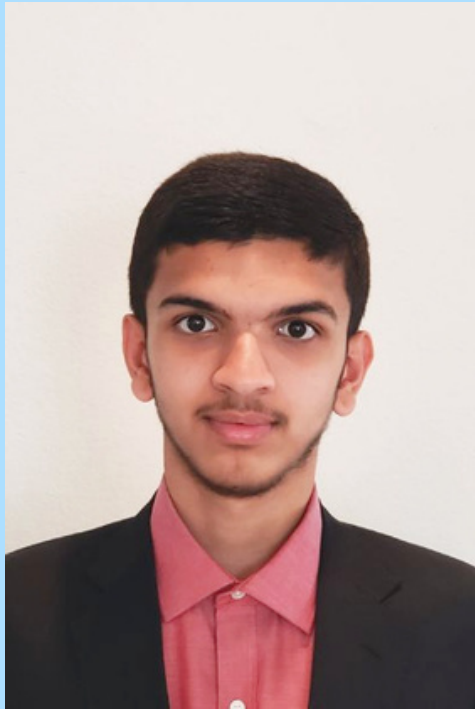

WRITERS GUILD STRIKE

Turning on the TV and flipping between Netflix, Disney+, and Hulu to find your next favorite show seems like a simple process. However, whether it be an Avengers film or the newest episode of Wild Kratts, every piece of fictional media involves countless hours in a writing room as ideas are hypothesized, tested, and approved. Every detail in these shows is chosen meticulously, as writers must keep an audience, director, streaming service, and personal approval in mind—often resulting in intense work hours with subpar pay.

Writers in Hollywood are paid per episode, which wasn't an issue before streaming services, as seasons included 22+ episodes a season with one playing each week. Now that Netflix and Disney are producing 8-10 episode seasons and (in Netflix's case) uploading the whole season in one day, writers must scramble to do higher quality work in less time while being paid less as fewer episodes are being created. The Writer's Guild of America, a union representing writers in Hollywood, presented a series of demands to studios in lieu of these developments. Upon being denied, they declared a strike, creating a frenzy on the streets and social media. A call to action has been communicated by writers and actors alike.

The effects of these strikes have already taken a toll on the entertainment industry and have likely delayed shows you enjoy. Popular late-night shows such as SNL have closed their doors, filming for the much-awaited season 5 of Stranger Things has been delayed, and the host of Jeopardy! has stepped down. These few examples showcase how integral each facet of media production is and how there is much more than just an actor when you turn on the TV. So the next time you and your family sit to watch a movie together, think about the months of writing, rewriting, and drafting that went into the final product.

THOUSANDS

KILLED

IN

GUN VIOLENCE

School shootings, horrifying for kids, teachers, parents, and communities, inevitably spark divisive discussions about gun rights and school safety. We're still seeing these awful events in 2023, and the circumstances are just getting worse. According to the K-12 School Shooting Database, an independent research effort, 303 school shootings would have occurred in 2022 if the limits were expanded to include occurrences that happen after school, on the weekends, when a gun is exhibited or fired, or when a bullet impacts school property. The number of mass murders in the US is projected to reach an all-time high in 2023. When four or more persons are killed in a single occurrence, not counting the shooter or other culprit, it is considered a mass killing. More than one mass murder occurs every week in the US, on average. Since the beginning of the year, there have been 202 mass shootings, and it's only been five months since 2023 has begun. The United States experienced a record number of school shootings last year, followed by 202 mass shootings this year. In America, gun violence is currently the main factor contributing to adolescent death. And yet there are still school shootings. The toll these incidents inflict on those who survive them—children, teachers, families, and school staff—is incalculable. According to a database, there have been more mass shootings in 2023 than there have been days, which only fuels terror and rage.

Following the shooting in Uvalde the previous year, Biden managed a compromise gun control law that implemented some modest suggestions. However, as the shootings have increased in frequency, he has called on Congress to pass stricter legislation, such as the ban on assault weapons. There are little indications that this request will be acted upon. After the Allen shooting, the same trend kept happening. Concerned, Biden stated, "Once again, I ask Congress to send me a bill banning assault weapons and high-capacity magazines.

Enacting universal background checks. Requiring safe storage. Ending immunity for gun manufacturers. I will sign it immediately. We need nothing less to keep our streets safe."

School shootings are not the only type of mass murder happening. Shootings, in general, have increased, and people have become more manic towards how they do it. For example, in recent news, On Monday, April 10, 2023, Connor Sturgeon, a 25-year-old bank employee, opened fire at the Old National Bank in Louisville, Kentucky, using an assault-style weapon. Sturgeon, according to recently revealed police records, the Kentucky bank shooter, planned the massacre and put his phone in his front shirt pocket to video the deaths. The extent to which someone can behave so heinously in public shocks many people. As a result, more people began to speak out in outrage and urge for action to end these atrocities. Schools, banks, and shopping malls should not be places where people are afraid to go but where they can find joy and safety. Again, five years after the deadly shooting in Santa Fe, Texas, President Biden criticizes Congress for failing to pass gun legislation. He said, "Congress must act to require safe storage, to ban assault weapons and high-capacity magazines, to enact universal background checks, and end immunity from liability for gun manufacturers. Our kids, educators, school officials – and all Americans – deserve nothing less."

AN UNORTHODOX DOCUMENT LEAK

There is always a level of ludicrous within the public when it comes to information leaks—as active consumers of the film industry, we’ve started to associate leaks with intricate missions and taboo puzzles—and thus, time and time again, we make the mistake of oversight.

Last month, this proved to be fatal when member of the Massachusetts Air National Guard Jack Teixeira leaked several classified Pentagon documents into his small, homely Discord Server under the handle “OG.” Most of the server’s occupants—from teenage boys to grown men—disregarded Teixeira’s complex, acronym-ridden messages, focusing instead on idle conversation and an intense fascination with military gear. The few members who bothered encrypting Teixeira’s coded messages (which began to arrive in the hundreds over the month) realized the content and the extreme importance of what “OG” was telling them. Then, when transcribing became too much, Teixeira began to send images.

These images were by far the most eye-catching thing Teixeira had exposed over the course of his server-wide enlightenment. They covered battle charts in Ukraine, information about the Chinese Spy Balloon, and the trajectory of foreign nuclear missiles. Once readily available via visuals, they became all the more tempting to members of the server who, up until that point, had been more interested in Youtube videos and watching movies together on Discord. Images were, however, a difficult choice.

On February 28, a member of Teixeira’s server posted the images on another channel. These documents then appeared in a Discord server dedicated to Minecraft. By March, thousands of Discord users had access to classified documents, but the government was none the wiser. The leaks began to spiral toward other platforms until April, when Russian Telegram channels began to post about the documents, culminating in an article by the New York Times and later in Teixeira’s arrest.

But the question remains: how was it this easy for Teixeira to reveal such sensitive information? A quick look at U.S. information clearances explains Teixeira’s access: there are clearance levels for specific positions, and over 3,000 U.S. officials are given access to the same information Teixeira leaked to the public. So, in the end, “OG” did not have to disable laser traps or sneak a microchip into the hem of an unsuspecting coat. Instead, as a member of the National Guard, the information he leaked was readily available.

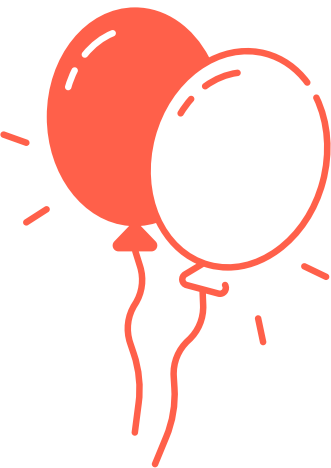
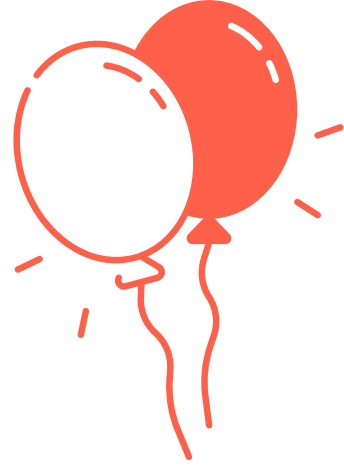
Time and time again, oversight is society’s vice. In the future, the government will keep a closer eye on Discord channels—but it is all the more likely, with the emergence of new tech, that they will have to keep up the pace to prevent leaks like the one Teixeira was capable of maintaining for over two months.
